- Organizational support (e.g., for courses and scientific conferences/workshops)

- Interest in some of the research topics mentioned above
- Very good knowledge of quantitative methods of social research
- Experience with STATA and/or R as well as MS Office
- Very good knowledge of English
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team
- Prior experience in or willingness to acquire skills in the programming of web pages.
